Safety, Care and Regulatory Information

▶ Important safety information

Read and follow all instructions marked on the product and in the documentation before you operate your system. Retain all safety and operating instructions for future use.

- * The product should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the rating label.
- * If your computer has a voltage selector switch, make sure that the switch is in the proper position for your area. The voltage selector switch is set at the factory to the correct voltage.
- * The plug-socket combination must be accessible at all times because it serves as the main disconnecting device.
- *All product shipped with a three-wire electrical grounding-type plug only fits into a grounding-type power outlet. This is a safety feature. The equipment grounding should be in accordance with local and national electrical codes. The equipment operates safely when it is used in accordance with its marked electrical ratings and product usage instructions

1-1: Product Introduction

The GIGABYTE GR-SS301SJ is a SCSI storage expansion. It is ideal for extending server storage capacity. By the high speed Ultra 320 SCSI interface, servers can get a large space to save more data. The storage expansion is designed for continuous serve environment. The redundant and hot-swappable modules help administrators to get the maximum working time without any downtime for reparing.

GR-SS301SJ has two Ultra 320 SCSI channels. Each channel can control seven hot-swappable disks and has one build-in SCSI terminator. In front side, there are four LED to indicate the status of SCSI channel, fan, hard disk, and power. It has two redundant power supplies for continue service. The fourteen hard disk trays all have independent key lock to avoid un-expectative swapping.
















Step1. Rail kit assembly.




Step2. Rack mount front end assembly.




Step3. Rack mount rear end assembly.




Step4. Handle assembly.




Step5. Rear fix plate assembly.




Step6. System insert.



Step7. System rear assembly.




Step8. Front fix assembly.




Step1. Tower base assembly.




Step2. Cover fix assembly.




Step3. Tower cover assembly.




3-3: Hard Disk Drive Assembly
